HOW MUCH OF OUR DAYS WORK GOES TO THE BOSS' SURPLUS?

ATT has 957,000 employees

113,000 are managers and officials

101,000 are professionals

743,000 are non-supervisory employees

---\$28,957,000 was the total revenue received from sales and services

---\$11,416,000 went for the wages of non-supervisory workers and professionals

--- \$4,038,000 went to pay for depreciation and repairs on plants and machinery.

---\$13,453,000 is the boss' surplus This went to:

**\$2,260,000 to the salaries of managers and officials

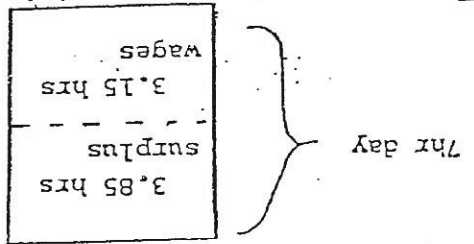
**\$5,071,000 for taxes;

**\$2,296,000 to banks and bond holders in the form of interest

**\$1,266,000 for marketing (advertising)

**\$2,178,000 in the form of dividends to the owners

To see this in terms of a 7 hr working day for the average non-supervisory worker and professional 3.15 hrs goes to reproduce your wages and 3.85 hrs goes to the surplus *



*These numbers are derived by dividing the non-supervisory and professional wages bill and the surplus by the sum of the two. The proportion is then multiplied by a seven hour day.
